# ABOUT USC KAUFMAN



Founded in 2012 by a transformational gift from visionary founder Glorya Kaufman, the University of Southern California created its sixth art school and, at that time, its first new school in nearly 40 years. The USC Glorya Kaufman School of Dance admitted its first class in 2015 and immediately expanded USC's unique signature as a world-class research institution with a deep commitment to the arts.

The exciting opportunity to create a new school brought the chance to rethink the professional degree for the 21st century and the role of a dance school within the greater national ecology. To fulfill this monumental intention, USC Kaufman envisioned a new model of dance education, called "The New Movement"—a hybrid and collaborative approach expressed in studio practice, music, choreography, performance, new media, and scholarship, where artistic preeminence is combined with thoughtful industry access.

By encouraging interdisciplinary and collaborative work, USC Kaufman seeks to transform dance. It embraces the artistic rigor of conservatory dance instruction with the unparalleled academic opportunity offered by one of the world's leading universities.

The program encourages students to think across boundaries and take advantage of the diverse cultures both on campus and within the Los Angeles arts community. Students approach the study of dance with a global perspective, reinforced through collaboration with national and international artists.


In addition to supporting the choreographic research of a stellar faculty, the school continues to forge relationships with some of the dance world's most innovative creators. USC Kaufman dancers have had the privilege of dancing the iconic repertory of Jiří Kylián, Ohad Naharin, and Crystal Pite, as well as working with recent Artists-in-Residence Tessandra Chavez, Peter Chu, Tyce Diorio, Justin Peck, Max Pham, Dani Rowe, Caili Quan, Toyin Sogunro, Spenser Theberge, Doug Varone, and Yin Yue, among others.

Graduates of the BFA program have secured contracts with Broadway productions, cruise ships, and dance companies including Ballet Austin, Ballet BC, Ballet Hispánico, Ballets Jazz Montréal, BalletX, Complexions Contemporary Ballet, Gibney Company, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, The Joffrey Ballet, LA Dance Project, Oregon Ballet Theatre, RUBBERBAND, Staatsballett Berlin, and Sydney Dance Company, among others. Alumni have also performed at the Academy Awards, Super Bowl, in movies and commercials, at Coachella and other music festivals, and on tour with artists like Kali Uchis, Olivia Rodrigo, and Jennifer Lopez. They have also gone on to pursue careers in choreography, arts administration, marketing, and business.

# Kyle Abraham

USC Kaufman Claude and Alfred Mann Endowed Professor in Dance Choreographer: Medulla Problems

(Artistic Director, A.I.M by Kyle Abraham) and his choreography have been featured in *Document Journal*, *Vanity Fair*, *Ebony*, *Kinfolk*, *O Magazine*, *Vogue*, and *Vogue UK*, amongst other publications. Abraham is the proud recipient of a Dance Magazine Award (2022), Princess Grace Statue Award

(2018), Doris Duke Award (2016), and MacArthur Fellowship (2013). In addition to performing and developing new works for his company, Abraham has been commissioned by a wide variety of dance companies, including Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, The National Ballet of Cuba, New York City Ballet, Paul Taylor American Modern Dance, and The Royal Ballet. He serves as the Claude and Alfred Mann Endowed Professor in Dance at The University of Southern California (USC) Glorya Kaufman School of Dance (2021-). Abraham sits on the advisory board for *Dance Magazine* and Hubbard Street Dance Chicago. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the inaugural Black Genius Brain Trust, and the inaugural cohort of the Dorchester Industries Experimental Design Lab, a partnership between the Prada Group, Theaster Gates Studio, Dorchester Industries, and Rebuild Foundation.



#### Bret Easterling USC Kaufman Lecturer

### **Choreographer: On Second Thought**

Bret Easterling's career began at the age of seven. He danced in commercial work with Angela Lansbury in *Mrs. Santa Claus*, and in Fiona Apple's music video for *Paper Bag*. He was a founding member of Teen Dance Company of the Bay Area, an original cast member of New York Stage Original's Tap Kids,

and an annual performer in the *Radio City Christmas Spectacular*. Bret studied at The Juilliard School, where he received his BFA and the Hector Zaraspe Prize for Choreography in 2010. While in school, he was a formative member of Andrea Miller's Gallim Dance, and a guest performer with Buglisi Dance Theatre. Upon graduation, Bret was invited by Ohad Naharin to join the Ensemble Batsheva in Tel Aviv, Israel, and ultimately promoted to the acclaimed Batsheva Dance Company.



#### Nina Flagg USC Kaufman Lecturer Choreographer: Landing

As an LA native, Nina's classical Ballet and Modern Dance training began with her mother Karen McDonald and expanded to Jazz, West African, and Tap. After graduating from LACHSA and UCLA (B.A. in Sociology & Communications), Nina deepened her Hip-Hop/Street Dance training as a

principal dancer with Philadelphia-based company Rennie Harris Puremovement. Over the past two decades, Nina's practice has evolved as a multi-lingual embodied conversation, explored through the lens of Hip-Hop consciousness. The plurality of her training has lent itself to a diverse career in concert and commercial dance, as well as academia. Nina has been on faculty at CalArts, UCLA, Connecticut College, and LMU. She has worked with such artists as Prince, Tina Turner, Bette Midler, Beyoncé, Chris Brown, and J Balvin. Her choreography has been featured on The Grammy's, TV Land Awards, NBC/Peacock, and Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater. Her television appearances include The Oscars, Today Show, Good Morning America, and Netflix. In 2021, she appeared in the documentary film *AILEY*, released in theaters nationwide. Nina is currently enjoying her second year on faculty at the USC Glorya Kaufman School of Dance, teaching courses in Hip-Hop and Dancehall studies. As a BIPOC artist and educator, Nina remains passionate about creating curricular strategies for equitable, multi-generational engagement in dance education and live performance. (ninaflagg.com.)

#### Roderick George USC Kaufman Artist-in-Residence Choreographer: Rated Human R

Native Houstonian Roderick George studied dance at Ben Stevenson's Houston Ballet Academy, The Alvin Ailey School, Miami City Ballet, LINES Professional Program, and the High School for the Performing and Visual Arts (HSPVA) in Houston, TX. Before starting his professional career, he was a bronze winner of the Youth American Grand Prix in New York City in 2005.

He was elected as a Presidential Scholar under the YoungArts Foundation in 2003 and joined Cedar Lake Contemporary Ballet in 2005. He later worked with Ballett Basel/ Theater Basel in 2007 and with the Goteborg Operan DansKompani. After that, Roderick joined The Forsythe Company (TFC) in Frankfurt, Germany. He has choreographed for SUNY Purchase, Boston Conservatory at Berklee, HSPVA, Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre, Springboard Danse Montréal, University of Utah, Los Angeles Contemporary Dance Company, etc. He has appeared in *Dear White People*, Louis Vuitton SS 22 Fashion Visual, and *Hercules and Love Affair* music video alongside being a freelance artist.



# **Bruce McCormick**

### USC Kaufman Associate Professor of Practice Choreographer: Flow Change

Bruce McCormick is a choreographer, performer, educator and scholar. He earned his BFA from The Juilliard School and his MFA from the University of Washington, where he was also on faculty. He performed in twelve countries on four continents as a member of Les Grands Ballets

Canadiens, the Bavarian State Ballet, and the Bern Ballet, where he was a soloist and ballet master. He also served as Assistant Artistic Director of North Netherlands Dance and Guest Rehearsal Director with Ballet BC. McCormick has choreographed throughout the Americas, Europe and Asia for the concert stage, opera, site-specific work and film. In 2018, he joined the faculty of the University of Southern California Glorya Kaufman School of Dance where he serves as Associate Professor of Practice in Ballet Technique. McCormick's research interests incorporate leadership, pedagogy and anatomy within the contexts of ballet, partnering and rehearsal direction. Additionally, he is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist.



### Garen Scribner USC Kaufman Artist-in-Residence

Répétiteur: Within the Golden Hour

Garen Scribner is a producer, manager, and repetiteur based in Los Angeles. As a dancer, he starred in the Broadway and National Tour productions of *An American in Paris* after a decade as a soloist with the San Francisco Ballet and artist of Nederlands Dans Theater 1. His broadcast television

series *Broadway Sandwich* for PBS has been nominated for 6 NY Emmy Awards and *VOGUE* called his film *Corps-en-tine* for The Australian Ballet "one of the best things to come out of quarantine." Today, Garen runs Pilot MGMT, an artist management and production company representing world-class talent from across the industry. He is also the managing director of the San Francisco Dance Film Festival. Garen holds a Master's degree in Public Administration from Harvard University.

Christopher Wheeldon, OBE (Director & Choreographer) trained at The Royal Ballet School, he joined New York City Ballet in 1993 and was named first resident choreographer. Christopher has created productions for The Royal Ballet and major ballet companies worldwide. He has choreographed for opera, film and television and is an Olivier Award winner for his ballets

Aeternum and Polyphonia. In 2014, Mr. Wheeldon directed and choreographed the musical version of *An American in Paris*, which had productions in Paris, on Broadway, and in London. Most recently he directed and choreographed *MJ The Musical* (2022), both winning four Tony Awards, including Best Choreography. The latter is currently on Broadway, touring in America, and opened in London's West End in March 2023.



### Nathan Scheuer Lighting Designer

Nathan W. Scheuer is a faculty member of the USC School of Dramatic Arts and a lighting and projection designer. Select credits include designs for The Muny, Tuacahn, Theatre Under the Stars, New York Opera Society, St. Louis Rep, Los Angeles Ballet, Barak Ballet, Capital Rep, Broadway Sacramento at Music Circus, Faculty Inc, Adirondack Theatre Festival, Berkshire Theatre Festival, Bucks County Playhouse, Arkansas Rep, TheatreSquared, Spectrum

### Robert Roldan

#### Creative Director: "Move Ya Body" 4 Camera

Robert is from Thousand Oaks, California. As a dancer after graduating from high school he joined the Contemporary Ballet Company "Bad Boys Of Dance" as a soloist. Robert choreographed three seasons of *SYTYCD* and became an Associate Producer for two seasons. He recently was the Associate Director and Choreographer on the *Dancing With The Stars Live Tour*.

He's won The New York Film and Television Award, five consecutive Record of the Year Awards, and two National Music Awards for his contributions to music. For *So You Think You Can Dance* alone, he received five consecutive Emmy nominations between 2011-2015 as Executive Producer. Jeff was Showrunner/Executive Producer on the CBS show *Come Dance With Me*. In 2022, Thacker was honored to be invited onto the Board of Councilors here at USC Kaufman.
